Our *Speaker of the Day* was Jenny Mills who spoke about her grandfather, Colonel George W. Barber, who attended the autopsy of the Red Baron in April 1918—the day after the Baron was shot down.

Colonel Barber was responsible for the management of the Australian Army Medical Services in France—that included the Australian Flying Corps. While there were a number of versions of how the Baron met his end, it now generally agreed the fatal shot was fired by Sergeant Popkin of the 24th Machine Company, Australian 4th Division.

It was obvious that Jenny had done a great deal of research into the reports and correspondence relating to the matter. Thank you Jenny for the presentation of a fine paper.
