# John Wager (Part 1)

John Wager took us through the amazing life of Sir Stanley Hooker. At the start of WWII Hooker was employed at Rolls Royce where he expanded the theory on centrifugal compression and doubled the power output of the RR Merlin engine. His design of the two-stage supercharger, with intercooler, played an important part in battle for air supremacy in 1941. Merlins powered the Hurricane, Spitfire, Mosquito and the Lancaster.

Hooker's knowledge of fluid mechanics brought him into contact Sir Frank Whittle. Their association led to accelerated progress in the development of the jet engine.

After WWII, Hooker was deeply involved in the development of the Rolls Royce *Nene* engine, at that time it was the most powerful jet engine in the world.

POOF... and that's when the lights went out; the projector shut down, and the air conditioning ceased to work.

A unanimous decision was immediately made to call our speaker back to the next meeting to continue his story.
